THE STATE OF THE MEXICAN OIL AND GAS MARKET

Participating in the energy trade mission to Mexico City and León will give you the inside perspective on the development of the Mexican oil and gas industry.

In the period 2012-2018, which marked the liberalization of the energy market, the focus of the Mexican government was on licensing rounds. 2019 marks a new phase in the Mexican oil and gas industry.

Mexico's new administration, that took office on the 1st of December 2018, is pushing for domestic production with NOC PEMEX and the 75 new operators. The Mexican government presented a plan to increase oil production levels to 2.624 million b/d by 2024, while gas production is to rise by 50 percent. PEMEX's 2019 budget is raised to US\$23 billion, a 26 percent increase compared to last year. President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador stated that he will respect the 107 private oil contracts awarded under the previous administration.

Thus far, the Mexican oil and gas sector saw 9 bidding rounds, 107 new contracts, 75 new operators, a contract execution success rate of 67% and an estimated investment of US\$161 billion. New operators include Shell, Total, BP and ExxonMobil, amongst others. In addition, BHP won Mexico's first farm-out for the Trion deepwater field.

The Energy Reform has resulted in a worldclass oil find off the coast of Mexico in the Zama-1 field in July 2017, where the consortium of Talos Energy, Sierra Oil and Gas and Premiere Oil made a discovery of over 2 BOE; making it the first and largest oil find by the private sector in Mexico. The drilling program started in December 2018. Other successful discoveries were those of Italian operator Eni in the Amoca-3 and Miztón-2 wells in the shallow waters of the Campeche Bay, offshore Mexico, with discoveries of 1,3 BOE and 1,4 BOE, respectively.

With these oil finds, Mexico was among the top three countries in the world in terms of largest volumes discovered in 2017, together with Senegal and Guyana.

Mexico offers international oil and gas companies, and their service providers, a unique opportunity to enter a region with large hydrocarbon resources and increasing upstream activity.
